






LAW-TRAIN is a training platform for law-enforcement officers that offers the ability to train interviewers and teams in a virtual environment. Funded by the Horizon 2020 programme, LAW-TRAIN is a multinational project, for creating a new and innovative way of training of interviewers for joint-investigations.

The partners created a framework and hands-on scenarios for preparing investigators to participate in multinational interviews concerning international drug trafficking, and to educate law-enforcement personnel in the intricacies of cross-border collaborative investigations. This highly interdisciplinary project intended to create newest technology (VR/AR and AI) which answers user needs and requirements in a very cost effective and user friendly way.



Why?

Crime is a multi-national issue that often necessitates cross-border investigations. On one hand, these inquiries are beset by obstacles and miscommunication stemming from different cultural and legal perspectives. On the other hand, training officers through role playing is very expensive. With LAW-TRAIN, law-enforcement agencies can cut costs while effectively train their officers in the conduct of joint investigative interviews through the virtual training platform.
